# Dining Guide



This Dining Guide will help you find somewhere to eat all of your meals on your trip to Bryce Canyon National Park.

It lists all the options available inside the park, including the general store where you can buy supplies for a picnic. There are also restaurant and grocery recommendations near the park, so you'll be able to find something near where you are staying in Bryce Canyon City or the local area.

While I haven't been to every single one of these places, those that I haven't tried personally, I have researched in detail before including them here.

If you try somewhere else and love it, feel free to email me and let me know, as I am always updating this list.

Note that some of the places listed here are only open for the main season April-October.

## INSIDE THE PARK

There are a couple of convenient meal options inside the park at and near the Lodge. The location is very convenient, and you'll probably end up eating there at least once.

Another option is to pack a picnic. There's a general store inside the park where you can grab something to go or get supplies for a picnic.

#### BRYCF AMPHITHFATER

#### **Bryce Canyon Lodge**

The dining room at Bryce Canyon Lodge is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. As far as national park restaurants go, it's not bad. Lunch includes the standard burgers, sandwiches and salads, but also more unusual things like elk chili. The dinner menu includes steaks, salmon and salads. You can also get orders to go. Open April to October.

## Valhalla Pizzeria & Coffee Shop

A casual café right next to the lodge. The pizza is pretty good and made from sustainable, organic ingredients. There are salads for healthier options, and beer and wine. They also serve coffee and pastries.

Open for lunch and dinner mid-May to mid-September.

## **General Store**

The General Store sells groceries, as well as 'grab-and-go' foods including pizza, soup, sandwiches, coffee, and ice cream. So, this is a great option if you're looking for something quick or if you want to get something for a picnic or to take on a hike. They also sell souvenirs, camp supplies, and firewood, and there are showers and restrooms.

It's located near Sunrise Point and North Campground and is typically open March to December.



## OUTSIDE THE PARK

While you will probably eat inside the park during the day, in the evening you have your choice of dining in the park, heading back to where you're staying, or trying a different nearby area.

#### **BRYCE CANYON CITY**

#### **Ebenezer's Barn & Grill**

This is a fun night out. There's a western-style buffet and then a show featuring country and western music. It's kind of hokey, but good old-fashioned fun and an entertaining way to spend your evening. It's located across the road from Ruby's Inn. Doors open 7:00PM, dinner is at 7:30PM, and the show starts at 8:00PM. Reservations are recommended. It's typically available late April to late October.

## **Cowboy's Buffet & Steak Room**

This is good for a quick and filling (and kind of average) meal. It's located in the main lodge of Ruby's Inn. It's heavy on western fare, burgers and steaks. It's open for breakfast, lunch and dinner year-round. There's a buffet available at breakfast and dinner

## The Canyon Diner

Also in Ruby's Inn, they serve standard burgers, salads, pizzas, etc. Nothing exciting, but it's convenient. They also do boxed lunches. Open year round for lunch and dinner.

## **Ruby's General Store**

In addition to souvenirs, there's a supermarket section that sells groceries, which is great for self-catering and for getting a picnic together if you want to eat on the trail or by the rim the next day. Open daily from 7:00AM to 10:00PM (check at Ruby's when you arrive to double check the time hasn't changed).

## Cowboy Ranch House at Bryce Canyon Resort

More Western fare, but with a twist of Mexico. The standard steaks, chicken, and burgers. Their signature dish is the three-pound Thor's Hammer Tomahawk Steak. You can also have bar food while watching TV if you like.

Open for breakfast buffet, lunch and dinner.



# **OUTSIDE THE PARK**

#### HIGHWAY UT-12

#### **Bryce Canyon Pines**

Pretty good "home cooked meals" like steaks, mashed potatoes, and gravy, soups, etc. They have a large selection of pies that are definitely worth trying!

#### **UpTop Steakhouse**

A basic diner-like restaurant that's open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

## **UpTop Market & Bakery**

There's a grocery store for self-catering and picnic supplies, plus a deli to get 'to-go' picnic supplies and sandwiches. The bakery sells pastries, breads, donuts, coffee, etc.

## Stone Hearth Grill at the Stone Canyon Inn

A step up from standard burgers, etc. The setting is beautiful, with a large deck beside a pond and small waterfall with lovely views, and a stone fireplace inside. The food is elevated, with delicious sauces and a nice wine menu. Open for dinner only March to October. Reservations are recommended.

#### **Showdowns Restaurant**

There's a small indoor section and a larger patio. Serving burgers, steaks, fish and salads. There is often live country music later in the evening. Open for dinner April to October. Dine-in and takeout are available. No reservations.
