This Accommodations Guide is here to help you find somewhere to stay on your trip to Olympic National Park.

This is not an exhaustive list, but instead is a curated selection with several options inside the park (lodges and campgrounds) and the other nearby towns/ areas for different budgets.

Note that some of these places are only open for the main season May – October or March - November.

INSIDE THE PARK

There are several lodges, cabins and campgrounds inside Olympic National Park. They are scattered throughout the park.

Most campsites must be reserved in advance on [Recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov) for the busy season (which varies slightly at different campgrounds and may change slightly each year but is typically late April-September). The details are included below. Heart O' the Hills campground and North Fork Quinault are the exception and are first come first served.

NEAR PORT ANGELES



Heart O' the Hills Campground

OPEN: Year round. Walk-in only during heavy snowfall

Heart O' the Hills is a NPS campground located on Hurricane Hill Road, about a 15-minute drive from Port Angeles. They do not take reservations.

The site is set in the lowland forest and has an active ranger program in summer. There are 105 sites. Most RV sites are for 21 feet, though they have a few for 35 feet.

- There are picnic tables, fire rings and grills
- Flush toilets and potable water
- No showers or laundry
- No hookups and no dump station

BETWEEN PORT ANGELES & FORKS



Lake Crescent Lodge

OPEN: Year Round. Late April - end December all days and January - late April weekends only.

This is a beautiful lodge that has sat on the southern shores of Lake Crescent since 1915. They have a restaurant, a small gift store, and kayak rentals.

Cottages: 1- and 2-bedroom cottages with 1 or 2 Queen beds and full bathroom. Doubles have mini-fridge.

Cabins: One- and two-bedroom options with full bath or shower, microwave, mini-fridge and fireplace.

Storm King Rooms: More modern hotel rooms in 2-story building with 1 Queen bed and shower

Lake Crescent Lodge

Marymere Rooms: Larger modern hotel rooms in 1-story building with 2 Queen beds and full bath

Pyramid Mountain Rooms: 2 Queen beds in hotel style rooms in older 2-story building. Full bathroom.

Lodge Rooms: Stay in the classic lodge. Double bed. Shared bathrooms.



Fairholme Campground

OPEN: Late April – late September. Reservable in peak season.

Fairholme Campground is located at the western end of Lake Crescent, about 35 minutes from both Port Angeles and Forks (it's halfway between them). Sites are first come first served for some of the season, but from late May-late September, are reservable. Blocks are released 6 months, two weeks, or 4 days in advance as follows:

- B loop campsites and the majority of the walk-to sites can be reserved 6 months in advance.
- C loop campsites and most of the remaining walk-to sites can be reserved 2 weeks in advance.
- A loop campsites and walk-to site 85 can be reserved 4 days in advance.

There are 88 sites. Most RV sites are for 21 feet, though they have a few for 35 feet.

- There are picnic tables, fire rings and grills
- Flush toilets plus spigots for dishwashing
- No showers or laundry
- No hookups but there is a dump station

Log Cabin Resort

OPEN: Mid-May - Late-September

Log Cabin Resort is located on the north shore of Lake Crescent, about 30 minutes from Port Angeles. They have:

Camper Cabins: 2 Queen Beds, Electricity; no plumbing (used shared restrooms and showers); picnic table and fire ring; pets allowed

Kitchenette Cabins: 2 bedrooms (1 Queen; 1 Double); Double pullout sofa; bathroom; 2-burner stove top; fridge; microwave; no pets

Non-Kitchen Cabins: 2 bedrooms (1 Queen; 1 Double); Double pullout sofa; bathroom; no pets

Lakeside Chalet: 2 Queens; shower; mini-fridge; microwave; picnic table; no pets

Lodge Rooms: 2 Queens; shower; mini-fridge; microwave; picnic table; no pets



Log Cabin Resort RV & Campground

OPEN: Mid-May - Late-September

the campground is part of the Log Cabin Resort, which is located on the north shore of Lake Crescent, about 30 minutes from Port Angeles.

There are 38 sites, and all can be reserved on the [Log Cabin website](#).

There are RV sites for up to 35 feet.

- There are picnic tables, fire rings and grills
- Flush toilets and showers
- Potable water
- Laundry
- Full hookups with electricity and sewer

Sol Duc Hot Springs Resort

OPEN: Late March - early November

Sol Duc Hot Springs Resort is, of course, where you'll find the hot springs. They also have a restaurant, deli, convenience store and small gift shop. Most of their accommodations are cabins.

Standard Cabin: 1 King or 2 Queen beds. No kitchen.

Kitchen Cabin: 1 King or 2 Queen beds. Fully equipped kitchen.

Duplex Kitchen Cabin: 2 Queen beds. Fully equipped kitchen.

Riverside Suite: A separate building with 3 bedrooms, 3 living rooms, 2 bathrooms, fully equipped kitchen, dining room. (sleeps 10). On second floor with no elevator.



Sol Duc Hot Springs Resort Campground

OPEN: Mid-March – Mid-September

The campground is located next to the Hot Springs Resort, about 50 minutes from Forks and an hour from Port Angeles. Tent and RV sites can be booked on [recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov) 6 months in advance on a rolling basis.

There are 82 sites in the campground and 17 sites in the RV Park. The campground sites can accommodate 21 feet, a few for 35 feet. The RV Park can accommodate vehicles from 26 feet to 36 feet.

- There are picnic tables, fire rings and grills.
- Flush toilets (in campground only) and potable water
- No showers or laundry
- Electric hookups and a dump station in the RV Park (no hookups in campground)

NEAR FORKS



Hoh Rainforest Campground

OPEN: Year Round. Reservable in peak season.

Hoh Rainforest Campground is located in the heart of the Hoh Rainforest, near the Visitor Center next to the Hoh River (about 50 minutes from Forks). It's first come first served for a lot of the year but is reservable for the peak season late May - late September. Blocks are released 6 months, two weeks, or 4 days in advance as follows:

- A loop campsites can be reserved 6 months in advance.
- C loop campsites can be reserved 2 weeks in advance.
- B loop campsites can be reserved 4 days in advance.

There are 78 sites. Most RV sites are for 21 feet, though they have a few for 35 feet.

- There are picnic tables, fire rings and grills.
- Flush toilets and potable water
- No showers or laundry
- No hookups and no dump station



Mora Campground

OPEN: Year Round. Reservable in peak season.

Mora Campground is located near Rialto Beach, about a 20-minute drive from Forks and 15 minutes from La Push. It's first come first served for a lot of the year but is reservable for the peak season late May - late September. Blocks are released 6 months, two weeks, or 4 days in advance as follows:

- A, B and E loop campsites can be reserved 6 months in advance.
- C loop campsites can be reserved 2 weeks in advance.
- D loop campsites can be reserved 4 days in advance.

It's a lovely site set among woods. There are 94 sites. Most RV sites are for 21 feet, though they have a few for 35 feet.

- There are picnic tables, fire rings and grills.
- Flush toilets and potable water
- No showers or laundry
- No hookups but there is a dump station

BETWEEN FORKS & QUINAULT



Kalaloch Lodge

OPEN: Year Round

Kalaloch Lodge is a beautiful old wooden lodge located right next to the Pacific Ocean. It's almost 100 years old and was originally built with lumber milled from driftwood logs that washed up on the beaches near Kalaloch Creek. They have a restaurant, gift shop and mercantile.

- **Main Lodge:** Hotel-style rooms with 1 or 2 Queens beds. Some have views. There are also 2 unique suites each with 1 King bed.
- **Cabins:** Small, studio-style cabins; cabins with private bedrooms; and larger duplex cabins. They have kitchens or kitchenettes. Sleep 2-8 people. Pets welcome.
- **Seacrest House:** Motel-style rooms all with full or partial ocean views, standard and suite rooms (suites have fireplaces). No pets.



Kalaloch Campground

OPEN: Year Round. Reservable in peak season.

Kalaloch Campground is located near Kalaloch Beach, about a 40-minute drive from Forks and 35 minutes from Quinalt. Some sites have views of the Pacific Ocean.

It's first come first served for a lot of the year but is reservable for the peak season late May - late September. Blocks are released 6 months, two weeks, or 4 days in advance as follows:

- A and B loop campsites can be reserved 6 months in advance.
- C and D loop campsites can be reserved 2 weeks in advance.
- E and F loop campsites can be reserved 4 days in advance.

There are 170 sites. Most RV sites are for 21 feet, though they have a few for 35 feet.

- There are picnic tables, fire rings and grills.
- Flush toilets and potable water
- No showers or laundry
- No hookups but there is a dump station



OUTSIDE THE PARK

While there are several options to stay inside Olympic National Park, most people stay in or near either Port Angeles or Forks to visit the main areas of the park. The other main area is Quinault in the southern part of the park.

PORT ANGELES

Port Angeles is closest to Hurricane Ridge, Elwha Valley, Lake Crescent and Sol Duc Valley.



LUXURY OPTION: [Olympic Lodge](#)

Located 1.9 mi from the city center, this is a lodge-style hotel. It has a seasonal outdoor pool, whirlpool, fitness room, business center, and free parking. There's a cozy lobby with a large fireplace. Rooms are wood furnished and come with free Wi-Fi, cable TV, a microwave and fridge, and include complimentary breakfast. They have 2 Queen beds or 1 King bed.



MID-RANGE OPTION: [Red Lion Hotel Port Angeles Harbor](#)

A very central location down by the harbor, less than a 5-minute walk to the ferry terminal. There's a seasonal outdoor pool, restaurant, lounge, fitness center, and business center. They offer free parking and WiFi and They have a variety of rooms with 1 or 2 Queen beds or 1 King bed. Some have private balconies with views of the Strait of Juan de Fuca.



BUDGET OPTION: [Angeles Motel](#)

This is a basic, clean motel just six blocks away from Port Angeles downtown bus station. There are a variety of rooms, but all have bath / shower, fridge, microwave, coffee maker, hair dryer, and cable TV. There is free WiFi and parking.



OUTSIDE THE PARK

FORKS

Forks is closest to Hoh Rain Forest, the La Push beaches and the Kalaloch beaches.

There are no luxury accommodations in Forks, but some comfortable Mid-Range and Budget options.



MID-RANGE OPTION: Woodland Inns

They have really nice boutique cabins. They are all unique, but 7 **Standard Cabins** have 2 Queen beds, and 2 Standard Cabins have 1 King bed and a Queen foldout sofa. All have a bathroom with tub/shower, kitchen, fireplace, and 50" flat screen TV. There are also 3 unique **Deluxe Cabins**. Each has a separate bedroom (1 King bed), tub/shower, gas fireplace, and a flat-screen television in the living room and bedroom. One cabin has a Jacuzzi and shower combo. Each living room includes a full-sized sleeper sofa.



BUDGET OPTION: Pacific Inn Motel

They have a variety of rooms. All have flat-screen TV's with cable, high-speed Wi-Fi, microwaves and fridges. There's an on-site laundromat. They have single Queen rooms, double Queen rooms (2 Queen beds), King rooms (1 King bed), and an Executive Suite (living room, bedroom with 1 Queen bed, full kitchen, in-unit laundry). They also have fun Twilight-themed rooms!



CAMPING OPTION: Bogachiel State Park

Located on Highway 101, 5.5 miles south of Forks, this is a lovely campground that's convenient to Forks and Olympic National Park. The campground offers standard and partial hookup sites (for RVs up to 40 feet), as well as hiker-biker sites. It is open year round.

There's a day use area with picnic tables and a kitchen shelter. There are restrooms, showers and potable water (no laundry). Dogs on leashes are allowed.



OUTSIDE THE PARK

QUINAUT

This is ideal to explore the Quinault Valley and/or as a stopover between Olympic National Park and Mount Rainier National Park.



LUXURY OPTION: Lake Quinault Lodge

This is a classic “grand and rustic” wooden lodge, built in 1926 on the southern shores of Lake Quinault. They have the famous Roosevelt Dining Room restaurant, a huge fireplace, a large lawn and lake activities. The outdoor rain gauge is worth seeing even if you don’t stay here.

Historic Main Lodge Rooms: Lake View (one Queen or King) and Standard (1 Queen or 2 Doubles). All have full bathrooms.

Fireplace Rooms: Gas fireplace, lake or forest views, 1 King bed, mini-fridge.

Lakeside Rooms: Partial lake views, 1 King or 2 Queen beds

Boat House Rooms: 8 rooms with an encircling veranda plus one second-story suite. Pets welcome on first floor rooms.



MID-RANGE OPTION: Rain Forest Resort Village

They offer a range of accommodations and are also home to the World’s Largest Spruce Tree. They also have the great Salmon House Restaurant and a general store.

Parkside Suites: Separate living room and bedroom (1 Queen); private deck with lake views, jetted tub, TV, fridge and microwave.

Fireplace Cabins: Lake views, private decks, different sizes (2, 4 and 5 people).

Village Inn: 16 hotel-style rooms (most have lake views), three styles of rooms: one Queen bed; two bedrooms; and a bedroom and a living room with a foldout bed.

RV Park: 31 Sites for large RV with electric hookup



OUTSIDE THE PARK

QUINAULT



BUDGET OPTION: Lake Quinault Inn

A basic motel. I've stayed here and it was perfectly adequate. They have singles (1 Queen bed), doubles (2 Queen beds), suites (2 bedrooms, 3 Queen beds plus a hideabed), and a cottage (2 bedrooms, 1 Queen beds and 1 twin bunk bed). All rooms have microwave, mini fridge, coffee maker, and full bath. Cottage has full kitchen.



CAMPING OPTION: Willaby Campground

This is located on the southern shore of Lake Quinault in Olympic National Forest. Sites can be booked on [recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov). There are 21 campsites that can accommodate tents, trailers and RVs up to 16 feet in length. No hookups or dump station. Some sites are in wooded areas and many of the sites have a view of the lake. There are flush toilets and potable water. No showers. Sites have a picnic table and fire/ grill.
