



Olympic National Park Dining Guide

Editor's Note

This Dining Guide will help you find somewhere to eat all your meals on your trip to Olympic National Park.

This guide includes places inside and outside the national park. I've also included some supermarkets so you can get supplies for a picnic or stock up if your accommodation has cooking facilities.

While I haven't been to every single one of these places, those that I haven't tried personally, I've researched in detail before including them here.

If you try somewhere else and love it, feel free to email me and let me know, as I am always updating this list.

Note that many of the places in and around Olympic are only open for the main season May-October.

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Parks Collecting



There are plenty of places to eat scattered around the Olympic Peninsula. I've included a handful here - you may well find other places that you love.

PORT ANGELES

Kokopelli Grill

The menu is heavy on seafood, but they do have some other options, including a couple with a Southwest twist (e.g., Carne Asada). It's a more upscale than a burger place, so if you're looking for somewhere a bit nicer, then it's a good option. Open daily for dinner. The [Hook and Line](#) pub is next door and open for lunch.

Graysons

Like most places in Port Angeles, this is a casual place. You order at the counter, and they bring your food to you. They have good breakfasts, really good sandwiches, and beer on tap. Open Wednesday - Sunday for breakfast, brunch and lunch.

The Corner Caboose

A permanent food truck serving excellent diner style food. If you're looking for something quick and tasty, then this is a good choice. Open Thursday - Saturday 11:00AM - 6:00PM.

Jasmine Bistro

Specializing in Thai food - and it's good. If you like crab, try a fusion of local and Thai flavors with their Dungeness Crab Fried Rice. Open Mondays and Wednesday - Saturday for lunch and dinner.

Safeway at 110 E 3rd Street

There are several supermarkets and plenty of small markets in Port Angeles. This one is my top choice if you're staying downtown as it has a good selection and is open daily 5:00AM to midnight. It has a bakery and deli, so it's great for picnic supplies or to stock a kitchen if you have one where you're staying.



BETWEEN PORT ANGELES AND FORKS

Lake Crescent Lodge

A classic national park inn restaurant with standard fare with a Pacific Northwest twist (salmon is on the menu).

Open late April – end December for breakfast, lunch and dinner daily.

Reservations are not required for breakfast and lunch but are recommended for dinner (call [360.928.3211](tel:360.928.3211)). You can also order takeout and eat at a table on the covered porch.

Fairholme Store

Located near the Fairholme Campground at the western end of Lake Crescent.

Open late May to early September. They sell sandwiches, snacks and soft-serve ice cream.

Sunnyside Cafe

Located at the **Log Cabin Resort**, it's a casual spot with views of Lake Crescent. Standard burgers, pasta, pizza, salads and sandwiches. Open for breakfast, lunch and dinner from mid-May to end-September. Reservations are not needed. Grab n' Go options are also available.

Springs Restaurant

The restaurant at **Sol Duc Hot Springs Resort**. Open for breakfast, lunch and dinner, plus Grab n' Go options in the gift shop. The lunch and dinner menu has a focus on Pacific Northwest (salmon is on the menu) but is pretty basic.

FORKS

Blakeslees Bar and Grill

It's not much to look at from outside, but it has friendly service and a relaxed vibe. The food is decent (think burgers, nachos, wings, etc.). Open Tuesday - Sunday for lunch and dinner.

FYABES Mexican Cuisine

This is a food truck, so super casual, but it's set up permanently and there are some picnic tables next to it. The food is good - and a nice break from burgers and pizza. The menu can change at any time, but is typically tacos, burritos, tostados, etc.

Westend Taproom

This is worth going to even if you don't like craft beers. It has a sports bar vibe. If that's not your thing, you can escape the TVs in the large covered outdoor area, where there are picnic tables. Their paninis are good. Open for dinner Thursday - Monday.

Thriftway (at Forks Outfitters)

This is my go-to supermarket in Forks. It's a large supermarket, and has a deli and bakery, so it's easy to find supplies for a picnic or for a full-service kitchen if you have one where you're staying. Open daily from 8:00AM - 9:00PM (deli and bakery close 7:00PM). Closed Christmas and Thanksgiving.

BETWEEN FORKS AND QUINALT

Hard Rain Cafe

Located on **Upper Hoh Road**, 5.7 miles after you turn off from US-101. I'm including it here in case you're on your way to or from the Hoh Rain Forest and you're starving. It's a very casual burger place. Open for breakfast, lunch and early dinner (9:00AM - 7:00PM). They also have ice cream.

Creekside Restaurant

Located inside **Kalaloch Lodge**. They have a small, pretty standard menu using locally-sourced ingredients. Try to get a table by the window or on the back porch for ocean views. Open year round for open for breakfast and dinner.



QUINAULT

Roosevelt Dining Room

Located in **Lake Quinault Lodge**, this restaurant played an important role in history. President Franklin D. Roosevelt visited Lake Quinault Lodge during a fact-finding trip in the fall of 1937. He enjoyed lunch in the later-named Roosevelt Dining Room and nine months later, signed a bill creating Olympic National Park. Open daily for breakfast and dinner and lunch on weekends. Dinner reservations are recommended (call [360.288.2900](tel:360.288.2900)). A pretty standard menu, but a great location.

Salmon House

A local told me this was the best salmon in the entire area and after going there, I won't even try to argue. The salmon (served several ways) is great. They do have non-seafood options (pasta, steak, burgers) as well. Grab a table on the back patio for views over Quinault Lake. The restaurant is part of the **Rainforest Resort Village**. Open for dinner (3:00 - 8:00PM only).

Quinault Mercantile

Located opposite Lake Quinault Lodge, this is a small general store where you can get supplies for a picnic and some basic groceries.

Dino's Pizza and Grill

A casual place in Amanda Park with a relaxed, sports bar vibe. They have a pretty standard menu of pizzas, burgers, chicken, fish & chips, etc.
